Lores Rízkalla

Born and raised in Los Angeles to parents who fled Egypt to escape jihadist attacks, Lores Rizkalla writes and speaks on political, social and gender issues, with particular emphasis on the Islamo-fascist war against the West. After teaching social studies as a high school teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for seven years, Lores entered the non-profit world, as the director of *Women Impacting Nations*, a Christian women's organization. She has spoken to women's groups and churches nationally and internationally. Lores has hosted *Lores Rizkalla Live* Sunday nights at 10pm on KRLA 870 AM in Los Angeles since February 2006. She continues to teach and is currently writing her first book, highlighting the unique history-shaping influence of women throughout the ages.



Philippe Karsenty

Philippe Karsenty is a French journalist and media critic. After a brief foray into French politics in 2002, he founded Media Ratings, the first ever French media rating agency. Media-Ratings has paid particular attention to the failure of the French media to document the rise of militant Islam in France.

Mr. Karsenty has successfully exposed the largest media hoax of this century - the so called "Mohammed al-dura murder" in which a twelve-year-old boy was supposedly targeted and killed by Israeli troops during the outbreak of the Second Intifada in September, 2000. The staged incident, broadcast on French public television, inflamed the Muslim world and has been used by Arab leaders ever since to encourage the murder and maiming of Israeli civilians.
